

GMAT AND PREPARATION CLASSES

Have the experience but no qualification? OR only have certificate or diploma level qualifications?

At GIBS we understand that not all applicants had the opportunity to pursue tertiary education, or they only have diploma or certificate level programmes as their highest qualification. This should not be a deterrent and we recognise that you are capable to add value and personal learnings and knowledge to our classrooms due to gaining the necessary work and management experience. The Council on Higher Education allows for 10% of any specific cohort to be admitted through a Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) process which requires a cognate level 7 or 8 (depending on the programme). The GMAT is a compulsory assessment to be written for non-degreed applicants.

What is the GMAT?

The GMAT (Graduate Management Admission Test) is an internationally recognised test designed to help graduate business schools assess the academic ability of those who seek admission to study for an MBA. Almost 1 800 graduate management programmes around the world use GMAT scores as part of their selection procedure. The Graduate Management Admissions Test (GMAT) is an American designed computerised examination that combines essay and multiple-choice formats. Decades of research confirm that the GMAT exam is a valid and reliable predictor of your academic performance in today's graduate management programs.

The GMAT is not a general knowledge test. It is an exam designed to measure your ability to think logically and employ a range of intellectual skills. Extensive preparation is required. Candidates are assessed in two broad areas: quantitative and verbal skills. The quantitative section includes problem-solving, basic algebra and geometry. Verbal reasoning includes reading comprehension, critical reasoning and sentence correction. Candidates can prepare for the GMAT by purchasing books and/or taking preparatory classes.

How to prepare for the GMAT?

GIBS does not administer the GMAT assessment, however Coefficient Solutions an external service provider offers GMAT preparation courses either at the GIBS campus or through online platform to assist applicants to prepare sufficiently and timeously for the GMAT assessment.

Applicants are taught techniques, strategies and approaches, and extensive practice is required in order to tackle questions within a tight time allowance. Most GMAT test-takers start preparing about 3 to 6 months before the desired test date.

The GMAT Prep course at GIBS runs for 32 hours of class time. Basic Maths assistance and Advanced GMAT modules are also available.
